

#### Tips for Travellers (1) Brian Bell

Over the next few editions of the newsletter, there will be a series of articles that hopefully will make travelling to Italy easier for those students who are thinking of going over there and putting their language skills in to action. Each month there will be a new theme, and I intend to cover the following: Flights, Accommodation, Insurance and visas, Public transport, Supermarkets and markets, Restaurants, Money, Photography, Electrical appliances, Schools and scholarships, Internet, telephones and Skype and last minute things to do before you leave. If there are other items that may be of use, then I am happy to research them and write on them too.

In this edition I will concentrate on the topic of "Flights". For the first or second time that you go to Italy, I would recommend that you take an escorted trip, such as the one that Giovanna escorts most years. This will give you an excellent orientation to Italy and also allow you to relax without having to worry about organising flights, accommodation and local tours etc. It will let you feel the general ambience of this beautiful country and hopefully stimulate you to want to go again soon. When you do want to go again, the first thing to really think about is how you are going to get there.

For novice travellers, I would recommend that you use a Travel Agent. If you are wanting to get the most out of your trip, and also to do it most economically then you need to do some homework before going to the agent, else you won't get the best deal. The initial things that you need to think about is your budget, when you want to go, how long you want to go for and where you want to go to. The temptation is to try and see as much of Italy as you can in one go. Try to resist that temptation, as Italy is a large country and there is much to see.

The cost of flights is seasonal, the cheapest being in the colder months and the most expensive in their summer. Italy can be very hot and crowded in summer, so the shoulder seasons are better value and less crowded. In general, the longer the time between booking and travel, the cheaper the fare. You need to work out whether you wish to travel economy, premium economy or business class. In round figures, economy flights are approximately \$2,000 and business class approximately \$8,000. Within economy, there are multiple levels. The seats are all exactly the same and can be anywhere in the aircraft, however there are different restrictions depending on the price. For example, there may be restrictions on how long you can stay away for, or restrictions on whether or not you can change your itinerary once you have booked it.

Armed with all of this information, go and visit your Travel Agent and see if they can match or better your prices or if they know of any special deals. These days there are low commissions (and hence little chance of a further discount) on international air travel and you must pay for your tickets within a few days of booking. Many agents will charge a commission if you pay via a credit card, so it may be worth you paying in cash or with a bank cheque



# CARNEVALE DI VENEZIA 2012 "LA VITA E' UN TEATRO – TUTTI IN MASCHERA"

The "Carnevale di Venezia" is an annual event that is steeped in history, dating back to the 1200's and earlier. In 1296 The "Carnival of Venice" became an official event, and the Senate of the Republic of Venice declared the day before Lent as a public holiday. Although it has not always taken place yearly, since its revival 1979 it has been an annual occurrence.

Even way back in the 17th century the "Carnival of Venice" has been a top tourist attraction, attracting wealthy Northern Europeans who came to the city to enjoy themselves. The fact that masks were worn meant that people could remain relatively anonymous, and it allowed the lower classes of Italian society to rub shoulders with the upper classes. This type of celebration combined elements of earlier Roman and Pagan festivals such as Saturnalia where festival-goers could let loose and enjoy debauchery!

Like Carnivals around the world the specific dates for the "Carnival of Venice" are dictated by Easter and so they vary somewhat from year to year. For 2012, the Venice Carnival will take place from the 11th to the 21st February. This year's theme is: "La Vita e' un Teatro – Tutti in Maschera" which means: "Life is a Theatre – Everyone in Masks".

The whole of Venice becomes a platform for the Carnival with different events happening here and there. St Mark's Square is usually the hub, and during the nearly 2 weeks you'll find people wearing masks all over the city. Of course Venice is one of the world's most popular cities when it comes to attracting tourists anyway. One can combine the Carnival with sightseeing around this truly beautiful city, enjoy a gondola ride on the canals, cross the famous Rialto Bridge, or marvel at the architecture of St Mark's Square. Visitors can also enjoy the arts by visiting some of the many excellent museums, ballet, theatre, music and shows performed during "Carnevale".

The masks however remain the trade mark of the "Carnevale di Venezia" and there are many excellent shops in the city where one can buy a mask - from the most beautiful and elaborate to the most frightening! Masks are on sale throughout the year, not just during Carnival time, though obviously during Carnival there are more choices and are in much higher demand! They are great as a gift idea, or to take home and hang on the wall.

The origin of the word "Carnevale" is disputed, some say that it comes from the Latin "carne vale" meaning "farewell meat", others say it comes from the Italian phrase "carne levare" meaning "remove meat". The idea was that the Carnival was a way of using up rich foods and meat just before Lent, as the forty days of Lent was a time when no rich foods, fats, dairy, meat or sugar should be consumed, and no parties or other celebrations could take place. So the whole community would get together, have a huge party, and eat, drink and be merry!
