LA BEFANA

In Italian folklore, *La Befana* is an old woman who delivers gifts to children throughout Italy on Epiphany Eve (the night of January 5) in a similar way to St Nicholas or Santa Claus. A popular belief is that her name derives from the Feast of Epiphany (Italian: *Festa dell'Epifania*). *La Befana* fills the children's socks with candy and presents if they are good, or a lump of coal if they are bad. She is usually portrayed as an old lady, wearing a shawl, carrying a bag filled with gifts and riding a broomstick through the air.

#### Kate Careless and her adventures in Italy – 2018

We flew into Rome in early September. Although I had been some 40 years before, I felt like I was in a movie with the camera swirling 360 degrees around me, my head was on a swivel, the sights, sounds and smells as I entered the eternal city reached every fibre of my body as I wanted to shout to the world ‘Posso parlare Italiano!’. Send me your menus, ask me directions, Rome shall be conquered!

Our journey was to take us from Rome, to Malta, back to Rome and on to the Amalfi Coast, around Sicily, across the ‘soul’ of Italy around the heel, up the spur and through Assisi and Florence before moving on to Pisa, the Cinque Terre and Stresa. After a short sojourn driving the Alpine passes surrounding Interlaken, Saint Moritz and Innsbruck, we were back in Italy for a drive through the Dolomites and Lake Garda before heading home from Milan. I was fairly positive I would be fluent in Italian upon my return!

Our hotel in Rome was but a few metres from the Pantheon – no need to ask directions! Being so central we were able to find our way absolutely everywhere on foot - from the Pantheon to the Vatican, from the Forum to Victor Emmanuel, from the Trevi Fountain to the Borghese Gardens and on to the Spanish Steps and the Piazza del Popolo. I loved that every time we opened a door there would be masterpieces lying in wait for our personal discovery tour. This same sense was mirrored throughout the country. I knew enough Italian not to struggle with what was on the menu but it appeared my Italian was not quite as fast as the locals who found it both easier and more economical to speak in English. I must admit though, everyone was very polite and some might say ‘tolerant’!

From Rome it was on to Malta and then back to Rome to pick up our car and drive to Amalfi via Herculaneum, a marvellously preserved town which suffered the same fate on supposedly the same day as its neighbour, Pompeii. One must wonder at the thought processes being used at the time of planning a holiday to think that driving from Rome to the Amalfi on day 1 of picking up the car was a bright idea! Let me just say one thing – after driving nearly 7000 kms through Italy, Sicily and its northern neighbours the ‘Italians must rate amongst the world’s best drivers!’

My knowledge of Italian and prior reading about parking regulations did not inhibit our actions and we are still waiting for possible fines for being in pedestrian only areas, resident only areas etc. It would appear the GPS does not discriminate and took us up many a laneway with no reverse exit point. Monreale, Palermo, Cefalu spring to mind.

My Italian was happily used in the South for menus, directions and times to be places. People were genuinely pleased that I had made an attempt to understand the language. Satisfaction would set in momentarily before they would speak to each other at a rate I could only dream of. Keeping up with the local level of conversation was a challenge of Himalayan proportions!

Seriously though, what is there not to absolutely love about Italy? The natural springs throughout Rome, so welcoming in the hot weather, name an artist, sculptor, painter of any note and their works are scattered throughout the country; a brioche dipped in gelati and followed by a coffee for breakfast in Sicily; the Greek temples of Agrigento and Taormina; the blackscape of Mt Etna; the Trulli houses in Alberobello or the caves of Matera; standing at the southern most point of the ‘heel’; wandering the streets of Gallipoli; driving the winding road to Monte Saint Angelo and the breathtaking views over the Gulf of Manfredonia. Let’s not forget the brilliance of Florence and all it has to offer; the magic of Pisa; the meditative atmosphere of the Cinque Terre or the beauty of the Italian lakes. The stunning, majestic and totally awe-inspiring Dolomites finished off a fabulous holiday where a new appreciation for another culture has begun. No, I did not come home fluent in the language, but I did come home happy in the knowledge that where I could give my language skills a go, then I did.
